## Cases are included in the CPS when:

The **Begin Date**, plus 180 calendar days, falls within the selected reporting period (a given date or date range, such as fiscal year).

When a party requests a Rev/Mod, the **Begin Date** is the later of:

- The receipt of the request for review; and
- The location of the non-requesting party.

In all circumstances other than when a Michigan party requests a Rev/Mod, for purposes of determining the **Begin Date**, both parties are non-requesting.

When a Rev/Mod is *required*, the 180-day Rev/Mod Timer Begin Date is the date on which a notice of review was mailed to both parties:

- A TANF/Medicaid mandatory review is a required Rev/Mod;
- A judge-ordered review is a required Rev/Mod; and
- An FOC-initiated review is a required Rev/Mod.

Each review is counted discretely for this performance standard and is a "Rev/Mod event" here and in requirements.

## Cases are excluded from the CPS when:

At the time the CPS begins, the Michigan Child Support Enforcement System (MiCSES) case is:

- Not a IV-D case;
- IV-D-closed, or fully closed;
- Pending a determination of good cause not to cooperate with child support requirements; or
- Granted good cause not to cooperate with child support requirements with a determination to end action.

When calculating the percentage of cases, the denominator of the Rev/Mod CPS is the number of Rev/Mod events where the **Begin Date**, plus 180 calendar days, falls within the selected reporting period.

For this CPS, the county of the IV-D case where the Rev/Mod event begins receives credit.

## Cases pass when:

The **End Date** is no more than 180 calendar days after the **Begin Date**.

An **End Date** occurs for one of these reasons:

- There is good cause not to proceed with child support action;
- All the children on the case are deceased;
- The IV-D case qualifies for closure under federal case closure criteria;
- The custodial party (CP) and non-custodial parent (NCP) are married or cohabiting with each other, and all of the children on the IV-D case are in their custody;
- After calculating a projected support amount, the difference between the existing and projected child support award is less than the minimum threshold for modification of a child support amount defined in the Michigan Child Support Formula;
- Michigan no longer has jurisdiction over the child support order;
- A party to the order becomes deceased;
- The review was opened in error:
- The review was opened on the wrong docket;
- The requesting party has withdrawn the request;
- One of the parties has filed a motion, and the IV-D program is proceeding with the court-ordered or court-referred review;
- A modified order is entered with the court (the End Date is the date on which the judge issued the order); or
- The requesting party fails to provide information necessary for the Rev/Mod to proceed after a second request for information has been sent.

When calculating the percentage of passing cases, the numerator of the Rev/Mod CPS is the number of Rev/Mod events where the **End Date** is no more than 180 calendar days after the **Begin Date**.

## Cases fail when:

The **End Date** is *more* than 180 calendar days after the **Begin Date**.
