 REDIRECTION NOTICE FOR  
 INTERSTATE CHILD SUPPORT PAYMENTS**

DATE: October 22, 2004

TO: ALL STATE CHILD SUPPORT IV-D DIRECTORS

If your state IV-D agencies are responding to a Michigan-initiated interstate child support case, this notice is to inform you of a redirection of all support payments to the Michigan State Disbursement Unit (MiSDU). Michigan county friend of the court offices will no longer accept interstate child support payments from other state child support agencies.

States currently remitting electronic payments to Michigan do not need to make changes.

Effective **November 1, 2004**, states currently mailing paper payments to Michigan are to redirect their payments to the:

**Michigan State Disbursement Unit (MiSDU)  
 P.O. Box 30352  
 Lansing, MI 48909-7852**

I encourage states sending paper payments to contact the MiSDU to begin the process to remit payments electronically.

Please ensure that all payments have the following identifying information:

- Payer's Name
- Payer's Social Security Number
- Michigan Docket Number or Michigan IV-D Number
- Michigan state and county FIPS code
- Amount of payment

You may include multiple payments with a single check if each payment is identified with these data elements.

As Michigan IV-D agency staff send new interstate transmittals to your state, they may include a IV-D number or a docket number as a case identifier. The MiSDU uses the docket number as the primary case identifier, but can accept a IV-D case number as the case identifier.
