- **SUBJECT:** Implementation of the End of the Child Support Cooperation Requirement for Food Assistance Program (FAP) Recipients

POLICY EFFECTIVE DATE: October 1, 2024

PURPOSE:

The policy to end the requirement for Food Assistance Program (FAP) recipients to cooperate with the child support program will be effective on October 1, 2024. On September 25, 2024, the legislature approved the administrative rule change to begin October 1. OCS introduced this policy in IV-D Memorandum 2024-016.¹

The system and process changes related to the end of the cooperation requirement for FAP and Child Development and Care (CDC)² recipients as discussed in IV-D Memorandum 2024-016 will be implemented on October 7, 2024 with the Child Support 24.3.1 Release.

This IV-D Memorandum discusses the availability of the forms and publications that were announced in IV-D Memorandum 2024-016. It also discusses the expected actions of IV-D staff between October 1 and October 7.

² For the purposes of this IV-D Memorandum, "Child Development and Care" refers to childcare subsidy programs funded under the Child Care Development Fund (CCDF). The end of the child support cooperation requirement for CDC was effective on February 25, 2024.

DISCUSSION:

A. Policy Implementation and System/Process Implementation

Effective October 1, 2024, individuals will no longer be required to cooperate with the child support program as a condition of FAP eligibility. Although IV-D letters and other printed materials will indicate cooperation is required,³ beginning October 1, IV-D staff are asked to refrain from telling recipients that reduced FAP benefits is a possible outcome of noncooperation. Recipients who receive Family Independence Program (FIP) assistance and/or Medicaid for children in their care are still required to cooperate.

On or about October 1, Bridges will discontinue sanctions on all assistance cases with reduced FAP benefits as a result of failure to cooperate with child support. This will benefit approximately 14,000 families across the state. Additionally, effective October 1, if MiCSES issues a noncooperation notice to Bridges for a family who receives FAP, those FAP benefits will not be reduced.

OCS will implement the system functionality to support this new policy in MiCSES on October 7, 2024. On that date, IV-D staff will begin using the processes and system functions introduced in IV-D Memorandum 2024-016.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) will continue to refer FAP recipients to the child support program and require OCS to offer those individuals IV-D child support services.
