



Important Notice

Michigan law requires the Michigan State Disbursement Unit (MiSDU) to send payments to you electronically. Electronic disbursement (payment) of child support means that you must choose to receive your support payments by direct deposit into a checking or savings account of your choice (a direct deposit authorization form is included on the back of this notice) or by a debit card.

If you wish to receive the debit card, you do not need to take any action. You will be automatically enrolled, and a debit card will be sent to you within 30 days. If you wish to have your payments directly deposited into a checking or savings account of your choice, you must return the direct deposit authorization form within 21 days of the date on the enclosed check.

If you need more information to help you make this choice, contact the MiSDU Customer Service Unit through your Friend of the Court (FOC) Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system and follow the prompts, or go to www.misdu.com.

The law allows limited exception to electronic disbursement of child support. Those exceptions are:

- Physical or mental disability barrier
- Language or literacy barrier
- Distance of 30 miles or more between your home and work and your bank or the closest ATM

Requests for exceptions are subject to verification.

If you believe you qualify for an exception, contact the MiSDU through your FOC IVR system.

Note: The debit card will not be an interest-bearing account, and no interest will accumulate from money applied to the debit card.
